Okaloosa County – The Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners honored retiring judge and veterans’ advocate T. Patterson Maney with a ceremony and the naming of the street which runs in around the Fort Walton Beach Courthouse in his honor.

Judge Maney spent more than 28 years on the bench. He spent some time away from the court during his time as a judge to serve in the United States Army, finally retiring as a Brigadier General with a Bronze Star and a Purple Heart. During his time on the bench, Maney was an advocate for those who had served in the armed forces. He started Veterans’ court to assist veterans in a difficult position.

Commissioners, city council members, state representatives and senators and a Florida Supreme Court Judge attended the ceremony.
